#### THE GCSE CURRICULUM

Our extensive range of GCSE subjects allows each student to tailor their program to achieve their goals. We celebrate every student's unique strengths, working closely with them to ensure they thrive. Our dedicated academic staff collaborate with a caring pastoral team to nurture each individual, fostering an environment where every student feels supported and valued.

#### HIGHER PROJECT QUALIFICATION (HPQ)

The HPQ is part of the GCSE core curriculum certified by AQA and equivalent to half a GCSE. It empowers students to pursue their passions through independent research into a topic of their choice, developing an original question to explore over 18 months.

Alongside weekly group sessions to build research, organisation and presentation skills, students receive oneto-one guidance from a specialist supervisor. The HPQ provides excellent preparation for A-levels and university.





#### **ACADEMIC EXPLORATIONS**

The Academic Explorations programme is an exciting weekly opportunity for students to engage with thoughtprovoking topics that are shaping our world. This is a series of short, focused modules taught by expert Sixth Form teachers, encouraging students to explore new perspectives and think beyond the boundaries of the traditional curriculum. 
#### ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

In addition to our extensive A-level curriculum, our Sixth Formers benefit from many enhanced learning opportunities allowing them to accelerate their progress and delve deeper into their academic and professional interests. Our Super-curricular programme opens doors to valuable experiences beyond the classroom, including independent research and participation in university seminars. Through these activities, our students expand their knowledge and skillset while strengthening their university admissions profile.

#### **EXTENDED A-LEVEL PROGRAMME**

Our EALP helps international students develop the fluency and confidence they need to thrive in school life. Our specialist teachers provide tailored support in small groups, focusing on academic skills such as essay writing, analysis, note-taking, and exam preparation. Beyond language acquisition, we encourage students to use English naturally in discussions, debates, and projects, helping them grow in independence and self-assurance. By the time they move into Year 12 at Sixth Form, our students are not only prepared for A-Levels and university but also equipped with the communication skills to succeed in a global environment.





#### FLEXIBILITY TO FIND YOUR PASSION

At d'Overbroeck's, we offer unparalleled diversity and flexibility in our A-level programme. Our Sixth Formers can choose from 37 different A-level subjects in sciences, humanities, foreign languages, fine arts, social sciences and more.

Choosing which A-level subjects to take is a crucial step in preparing for university. We encourage our students to explore their passions, which is why we don't have fixed option blocks. Instead, our students can study the subjects they want in any combination. Meanwhile, our Personal Tutors are always available to guide each student in selecting the right subjects to attain their higher education goals.

Our A-level subjects are taught by experienced teachers who are subject matter experts. With dynamic teaching and personalised attention, our students are motivated and inspired to achieve extraordinary results.

#### **DIRECTOR OF STUDIES (DOS)**

Every student in Sixth Form is assigned a Director of Studies (DoS). This is a highly individual relationship forged through frequent one-on-one meetings and discussions. Directors of Studies play a pivotal role in students' lives: they are the communication hub between a student, parents and teachers; they act as mentor, counsellor and academic advisor; they ensure that students are progressing well academically and are happy socially, from their first day in Sixth Form to their last, and often beyond.

By the time they finish, our students are more than ready for progression to A-levels.



### ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE (EAL) AT D'OVERBROECK'S

At d'Overbroeck's, we welcome students from many different language and cultural backgrounds. We know that joining a school in a new country can be exciting but also challenging, especially if English is not their first language. Our EAL provision is designed to ensure that every student feels supported, confident, and able to thrive both academically and socially.

#### **OUR APPROACH**

- Personalised support we assess each student's English level on entry and design a programme tailored to their needs.
- Specialist teachers lessons are delivered by experienced EAL specialists who understand how to build language skills in a school context.
- Integration with the curriculum EAL support runs alongside mainstream lessons, helping students access the full curriculum with confidence.
- Academic focus we teach the vocabulary, grammar and skills needed for success in subjects such as Maths, Science and Humanities.
- Examination preparation for older students, we also offer support for internationally recognised qualifications in English, including IELTS.

Beyond the classroom, our EAL programme helps students adapt to life in the UK, feel at home in the school community, build confidence in communication, and develop the language skills they need to thrive at school and beyond.

### CONTENT AND LANGUAGE INTEGRATED LEARNING

At d'Overbroeck's, we use CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) to give international students the strongest possible start. This innovative approach combines subject learning with English development, so students make progress in both areas at the same time.

Our teachers use proven strategies such as clear language goals, structured tasks, and targeted feedback to build confidence and encourage participation. With specialist training and close collaboration with our EAL department, they are highly skilled at adapting lessons for multilingual classrooms.

CLIL not only helps students thrive academically but also accelerates their language fluency, enabling them to contribute fully in class and school life. It also develops transferable skills such as critical thinking, collaboration, and communication – preparing them for A-Levels, university, and beyond.

# EXTENDED LEARNING TO EXPAND HORIZONS

As part of the Nord Anglia Education family of schools, our students also benefit from exceptional educational collaborations and transformational learning experiences. Through these opportunities, our students expand their skillset and their worldview.











#### **GLOBAL CAMPUS**

Nord Anglia's digital learning platform enables our students to connect with classmates from around the world as they explore fresh and exciting learning materials, including resources from The Juilliard School and MIT.

#### THE JUILLIARD SCHOOL

Developed in collaboration with this worldrenowned institution, our music, drama and dance programmes enable students to foster their creativity and self-expression with the guidance of leaders in the performing arts.

#### MIT

Our collaboration introduces our students to interdisciplinary STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and maths) learning. Through an up-close look at the work of MIT professors and researchers, our students are inspired to tackle real-world problems while developing a scientific mindset of experimentation and investigation.

#### **EXPEDITIONS**

Our students can join peers from other Nord Anglia schools for expeditions that expose them to different cultures, people and ideas. Examples include travelling to our own camp in Arusha, Tanzania, to work on the practical tasks of building and maintaining school and village accommodation, or undertaking mountaineering and outdoor activities at our centre in Les Martinets, Switzerland.

#### LEARNING WITHOUT LIMITS

Our academic enrichment programme helps students build life skills, pursue passions beyond the curriculum, and engage in enrichment, creativity, wellbeing, and leadership opportunities.

#### WIDER LEARNING DAYS

Students take time away from their normal timetable to work together on collaborative projects that explore real-world challenges. These days are designed to develop key skills such as teamwork, research, creativity, and presentation—often culminating in thought-provoking discussions and public speaking opportunities.

#### **SUBJECT CLINICS**

Run at lunchtime or after school, our subject clinics provide targeted support or stretch for students who need help with a particular topic or want to be challenged further. These sessions are an excellent way to deepen understanding and build academic confidence.

#### **DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD**





# STUDENT WELLBEING AND SUPPORT

#### **PASTORAL SUPPORT**

We believe students achieve their best when they feel safe, supported, and understood with strong wellbeing as the foundation for academic success.

At d'Overbroeck's, every student is guided by a dedicated Personal Tutor (Senior & International) or a Director of Studies (Sixth Form). They provide encouragement, guidance, and a consistent point of contact throughout a student's time with us. This sits within a wider network of support that includes trained counsellors, our nursing team, and boarding staff, all working together to ensure every student is able to thrive.

Tutors and Directors of Studies meet regularly with students to review academic progress, set goals, and provide tailored support. Just as importantly, they take the time to know each student as an individual, celebrating achievements, supporting wellbeing, and helping them navigate challenges.

For parents, the Tutor or Director of Studies is also a key link with the school, ensuring clear communication and a shared understanding of each child's journey.

# CAREER GUIDANCE FROM DAY ONE

From the start of their educational journey at d'Overbroeck's, we encourage our students to self-reflect and consider their desired academic and professional pathway. 
Boarding is popular with both UK and international students. For UK families, it offers independence, a vibrant social life, and more time for activities without the daily commute.










#### **EASY TO ACCESS**
